REACH AND TEACH

STAGING

Staging must be provided and set up at least one hour PRIOR to band's arrival for load-in. Stage dimensions: 24 feet of frontage with two 4 x 8 PA wings on each side for a total width of 32 feet. 12 feet deep with a 4 x 8 drum extension in the rear. See the diagram on Reach and Teach website. The stage must be a minimum of 3 feet high. If the stage is lower than 3 feet, please notify a Reach and Teach staff member for guidance. The stage must be situated 15 feet off the rear wall and have no obstructions (basketball goals) overhead. A black drape/skirt will need to be affixed to the front of the stage.

HOSPITALITY & LODGING

Six double hotel rooms are required checking in the night before the concert date. Private dressing room, bathroom, and backstage area with food, drinks, water, and coffee & creamer, required during load-in AND on concert day.

ELECTRICITY & INTERNET ACCESS

Must have 220-amp service within 60 routed feet of the stage. The band will need to connect directly to the power panel. If power access is beyond 60 routed feet, a feeder line will need to be brought to the stage. Reliable internet access is required for text message giveaways and various photo filter capabilities.

PARKING & SETUP

Parking is required for six cars and a 24ft truck. Vehicles should be accessible at all times. Setup will take place on the evening before the concert date. Access to the performance space and electricity is necessary. The truck (24ft long by 13ft high) needs to be within 10ft of the entrance to the performance space. The truck must be able to be unloaded onto a smooth hard surface. **NO STAIRS.** Eight students should be available to assist with load-in AND load-out.

PERFORMANCE

The show must take place on the school campus, during the school day, in a space with standing room only, and must be blacked out. All overhead lighting should be turned off and external windows covered. Event involves the use of a fog machine, which will occasionally set off the smoke alarm. Most local fire departments will supply a fireman to monitor the event personally, allowing the sensors to be disarmed during the event. Note: Glow sticks and beach balls are **NOT** permitted.
